

"In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." You have likely heard or read these words of Jesus from John 16:33. And you would probably readily acknowledge that Yes, there ARE troubles in this world. Many troubles, like disasters, deaths of loved ones, grave illness, or sudden job loss, are very visible and garner a lot of attention and support, at least initially. But you may not realize there is a whole other sort of troubles that is termed Invisible Disabilities or Hidden Disabilities.



Defined as disabilities that are not immediately apparent, these can include physical, mental, or neurological conditions that significantly impair normal activities of daily living. Think: chronic illnesses like diabetes or heart disease, anxiety, chronic pain, or other things that may not be easily detected by looking at or talking with a person. Nonetheless, such conditions may affect a person's physical, emotional, relational, and spiritual well-being.

People with hidden disabilities may feel invisible since others do not readily see or respond to their ongoing suffering. Perhaps you find yourself realizing you may be living with an invisible disability and feeling quite isolated or lonely. In view of Jesus' assurance that he has overcome the world, do you just say *Thank you*, *Lord* (which is a good thing to say!), then go on being isolated and lonely? Well, you could, but I hope not. Because God has overcome the world, he has equipped believers to bear one another's burdens and provide his love and support through caring ministry. At FEPC, we have Elder Shepherds, Deacons, 3 C's Committee members, and Stephen Ministers to hear your concerns. It may be helpful to have even a few listening sessions with a trained Stephen Minister (SM) to begin to address the issues of Hidden Disabilities in your life and find an appropriate spot in this spectrum of folks who would offer some care and concern if they only knew what you are facing. If so, please contact me or Pastor Kelly and ask for some help to get started.

The following announcement was posted in their Spring 2025 newsletter. We rejoice with them that they are now able to fly again.



Air Carrier Certificate

It seemed like a lifetime that we where unable to serve people during the certification process and in that time we kept our faith in looking to the Lord for strength and perseverance to stay the course that He had put us on to serve all that He brings before us in need of this service.

Grace on Wings earned its FAA 135 air carrier certificate on January 13th 2025 and is now able to continue serving the many families in need of air ambulance transport here in the United States. In the past Grace on Wings was under another certified air carrier out of Tulsa, OK and we would like to thank Air 1st Aviation Companies of Oklahoma, Inc for their support to the mission of Grace on Wings.

Timothy Two Project International







In the late 1990s, FEPC began an effort to reach the Aguaruna people in the jungles of the Rio Mayo (tributary of the Amazon) region outside of Moyobamba Peru. In conjunction with the congregation of the Moyobamba Presbyterian Church (home church of Hans Vargas!), several mission teams have traveled out to the villages where churches have been formed over the years. Language differences have always posed difficulty, but with translators, there have been great opportunities for sharing the gospel.

Timothy Two Project International — *continued*

In the summer of 2022, Justin Trent, Pastor Kelly and Matt Crawford were part of a Hope in the Harvest Missions International (HITHMI) team that traveled to Moyobamba to explore the possibility of expanding HITHMI into Peru. While there, they discovered a desire on the part of the indigenous pastors to have more theological training so they could better support their congregations.

While at the General Assembly in Colorado in June of 2023, the Crawfords and Kurths met Dan Sonnenberg, Latin America Regional Director for Timothy Two Project International. God was at work, providing for the needs of His people! Dan shared about the work their organization does to train and equip indigenous pastors and ministry leaders in the majority world who don't have access to theological teaching. They use a series of 4 workshops (84 lessons!) to train the pastors in systematic and practical theology and equip them to train others. It was quite the "a-ha moment" as it was realized by all as a wonderful way to provide for the needs the Awajun (as they are now called) pastors had shared with the team who met with them the previous summer.

The first of four 3-day workshops, "Knowing God: His Divine Attributes" was held in Moyobamba in October of 2023. The series of workshops were all led by Luis Rojas Espinozas who was already working with other groups in Peru. The remaining three workshops were held in Baja Naranjillo, the closest Awajun village to Moyobamba. Other topics included "Loving God: Transformed from Light to Darkness" (May 2024), "Trusting God: Practicing Kingdom Living in Relationships, Social Issues & Personal Issues" (October 2024) and "Serving God: Living Life in Response to Grace-Serving in the Church, the Community and The World" (February 2025).

At the conclusion of the February workshops, the participants received their completion certificates and heard a charge from Timothy Two founder, Steve Curtis. Curtis's charge was that they "take what they have learned in the workshops and apply the doctrines in their own lives as well as teaching them to others. In so doing, may the Body of Christ in Peru be encouraged, equipped, and empowered to impact the nation with the gospel."
